# Director's Report

October 2024

## **Department of Developmental Services:**

- Secretary Mark Ghaly announced that Pete Cervinka has been appointed Acting Director of DDS. Pete has worked since 2020 as the Chief of Data Analytics and Strategy for DDS and prior to that had extensive experience working for the Department of Social Services.
- DDS continues working on several workforce initiatives like regional center employee tuition reimbursement program, Direct Service Professional (DSP) training stipend program, DSP internship program, etc.

## **Legislative Update:**

#### Approved:

## AB 1906 (Gipson) Persons with Disabilities: Terminology

This bill has been amended from a simple update to more respectful terminology to requiring California Law Revision Commission, with input from stakeholders, to complete and submit to the Legislature a study with recommendations on how to replace the terms "dependent adult" and "dependent person" with new terminology that would respectfully describe those persons and would preserve the legal rights and protections of those and other persons, as specified.

Status: On September 14, 2024, the bill was chaptered\* by Secretary of State –
Chapter 233, Statutes of 2024.

## AB 1147 (Addis) Disability Equity and Accountability Act of 2023

Would enact the Disability Equity and Accountability Act of 2023, which would make various changes to the Lanterman Developmental Disabilities Services Act for purposes including providing increased oversight of regional center operations and performance. The bill was significantly amended on 9/1/2023 limiting the scope of the legislation, however, it maintained some aspects supported by the community.

Status: On September 28, 2024 the bill was approved by Governor Newsom.

## AB 2423 (Mathis) Developmental Services: Rates

This bill would require DDS to update provider rate models every other year, starting on July 1st, 2025. Rates will be subject to appropriation and the approval of federal funds, to review and update the rate models, as defined, per the cost inputs available at the time of the review.

The bill would also require the department to post the updated rate models to its internet website no later than January 1st of the following year. This bill is sponsored by the California Disability Services Association.

Status: On September 28, 2024 the bill was approved by Governor Newsom.
 Chaptered by Secretary of State - Chapter 904, Statutes of 2024. \*CHAPTERED after a bill has been signed by the Governor, the Secretary of State assigns the bill a Chapter Number, such as Chapter 904, Statutes of 2024, which is subsequently used to refer to the measure rather than the bill number.

## SB 1281 (Menjivar) Advancing Equity and Access in the Self-Determination Program

This bill would require DDS to establish statewide standardized processes and procedures for the Self-Determination Program, by January 1st, 2026, and to ensure they are applied consistently by regional centers, and that regional centers make measurable improvements towards achieving equitable enrollment in the SDP by race, ethnicity, and regional center.

Status: On September 29, 2024 the bill was vetoed by Governor Newsom. In Senate.

**SB 1463 (Niello)** - Would require the Governor to appoint to DDS a Deputy Director of Self-Determination, responsible for overseeing the successful implementation and operation of the program.

Status: On September 20, 2024 the bill was vetoed by Governor Newsom. In Senate.

## AB 1876 (Jackson) Developmental services: IPPs and IFSPs: Remote meetings

This bill, beginning January 1, 2025, would indefinitely extend the requirements that, if requested, IPP and IFSP meetings be held by remote electronic communications.

 Status: On July 3, 2024 the bill passed to the Senate and has been assigned to the Human Services Committee and Judiciary Committee for review. From committee: Do pass and re-refer to Com. on APPR with recommendation: To Consent Calendar. (Ayes 11. Noes 0.)

#### **Center Updates:**

## **Special Contract Language:**

- The Columbus Organization is conducting Employee Driven Self-Managed Work Groups for the topics of 1) workspace utilization, 2) recruitment/retention of staff, and 3) case management support/stabilization.
- Consultants have met with around 500 employees from all levels and at all locations to discuss concerns and suggestions for improvement to the various systems.

## **Self-Determination Program:**

- Participants that have fully transitioned into SDP with approved spending plans and active SDP IPPs: 428.
- NLACRC has a vacant position in the SDP Local Volunteer Advisory Committee. The
  committee members must reflect the multicultural diversity and geographic profile of the
  NLACRC catchment area.

## **Unity in Diversity Festival**:

• This event took place on 9/28/24 from 10am-2pm at New Horizons. We had a total of 499 RSVP's (includes individuals and CBOs).

#### **Voter registration:**

- NLACRC has developed messages to our community on the importance of voting in the upcoming elections.
- Community based organizations are supporting the efforts encouraging our consumers and families to vote.
- State Council on Developmental Disabilities and The Arc of CA developed a voter engagement project as well.

#### **Consumer Statistics:**

As of September 2024, the Center served 37,775 consumers and applicants, including 5,108 in Early Start, and 29,775 in the Lanterman program. The Center's San Fernando Valley Office serves 24,696 individuals, Antelope Valley serves 9,366 and the Santa Clarita Office serves 4,107 (these totals include applicants, and individuals served under Lanterman and the Early Start programs).

## **Special Events:**

ARCA Academy event was held on Friday, September 6th and Saturday, September 7<sup>th</sup> hosted at Inland Regional Center in San Bernardino. There were around 150 participants from all over the state. Topics ranged from board management, developmental services innovations and leadership. NLACRC was represented by 12 board members and executive leaders.


